Programme Elements

Induction Event: This programme begins with a two day overnight event to establish a peer network group which is fundamental to ongoing development.

- Workshops and masterclasses to stimulate and challenge
- Unparalleled access to world class manufacturing organisations and the leaders that have transformed the workplace
- Coaching from a highly experienced manager in a world class organisation
- Action learning sets to address business issues in a facilitated, confidential group setting
- Shadowing and exchanges within peer organisations to give fresh insights
- Benchmarking against peers and action planning for the future
- Online forums to share, discuss and assess resources.

Following the induction, delegates will undertake 4 modules of activity, each module is 4 days duration, every 6 to 8 weeks.

Modules include:

- **Empowering Leadership:** moving from a command and control stance to coaching and development, led by senior management
- **Innovation / Technology:** showing innovation as a key to the future – not a threat. Piloting new initiatives and joint learning, rather than forced change
- **Aligning the Business:** managing the consequences of accelerating change. Ensuring the front line is in line with the business goals
- **Enhancing Communication:** building strong communication across the business, with effective listening mechanisms that celebrate success.

The programme will be delivered primarily from the Centre for Corporate Connections at the University of Strathclyde Business School with visits to world-class manufacturing / operations environments.

The Benefits

- Empower and engage front line staff leading to better usage of skills and abilities - transforming management practice, developing leadership skills and adopting modern work practices delivered through a unique experiential learning programme
- Develop a support network with other SME owner/ managers – collaborating with like-minded peers to build a more productive future together
- Exposure to world class manufacturing and operational environments – enabling you to formulate high-performance workplace strategies. Benchmark against best in class organisations and develop a measurable action plan for continuous improvement
- Enhanced productivity and growth for businesses
- Creation of an open organisational culture that is positive, supportive and conducive to innovation and change to develop business growth.

Cost
